Landscape

Our Landscape company that we had for many years is no longer doing larger accounts, the owner's son, after having a bad ankle break, did not want to do this kind of work anymore. The board picked another smaller company out of Hillsboro, Means Landscape. We wanted a company where the owners are involved. So far they have sprayed weed control on the planting beds, put lime on our grassy areas. They are mowing the areas that are not too wet. Also this spring we are scheduled to do lawn aeriation, you will find little plugs of grass and soil on top of your lawn, this should help our lawns a lot. We have a few areas that will be treated for moss. If you have issues with your lawn, please do not talk to the landscapers, but contact a board member to get the issue addressed.

We have a lot of problems with cable companies ruining our irrigation and drainage lines, it is costing the HOA and all of us in the community to repair the damage.

Please contact the HOA Board to receive approval before the cable company digs in the common areas.

OH RATS!

This time of year, you may be hearing your neighbors (or finding yourself), having rats. Rats need easy and consistent access to a water source, even though they only drink between 15 - 60ml per day. They will eat almost anything available, but they do prefer to eat small amounts of a

variety of different foods. Here's a list of simple things you can do as a to prevent rat infestations. 1. Block rats' paths of entry into your home and outbuildings. Rats can squeeze through cracks 1/4 inch wide and through holes the size of a dime. 2. Deny rats a food source. Put trash in metal or hard plastic containers with tight-fitting lids. Feed pets during daytime hours and remove uneaten food. Clean up pet food and bird seed debris, and store pet food in robust containers with fitted lids preferably above ground level. 3. Deprive rats of a place to shelter by keeping your yard and house neat and clean. Remove brush and junk piles, old tires and appliances, and any other trash. Clean out trash and yard debris from underneath porches, decks and stairs. Store usable equipment and other off the ground,
